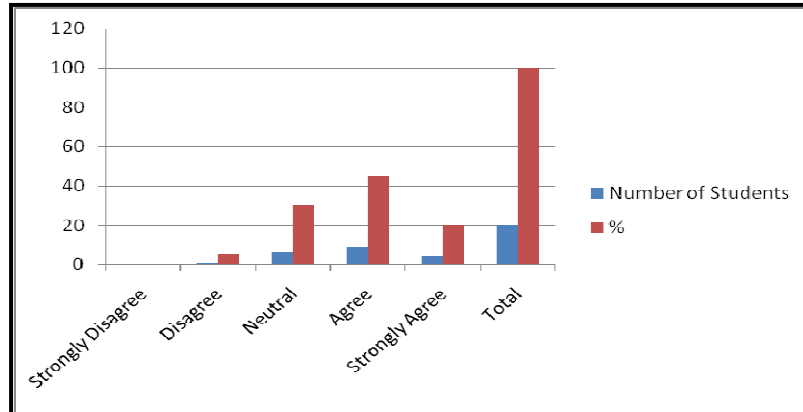

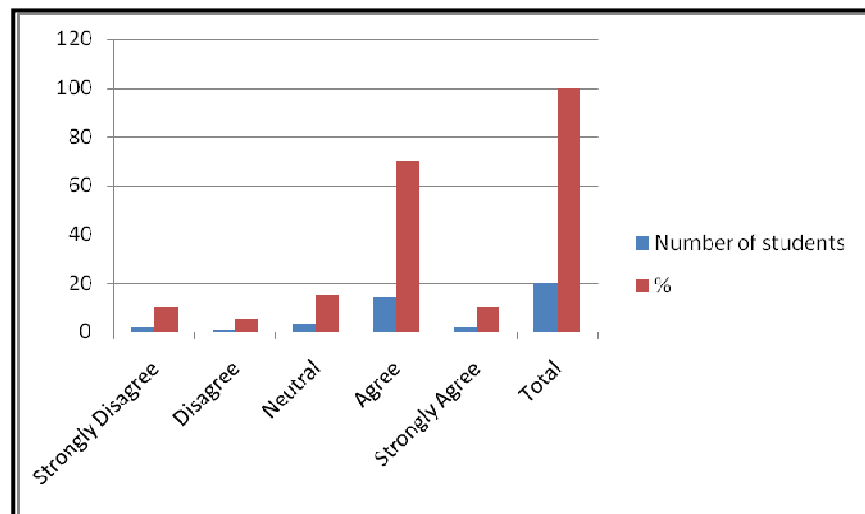


Interpretation:

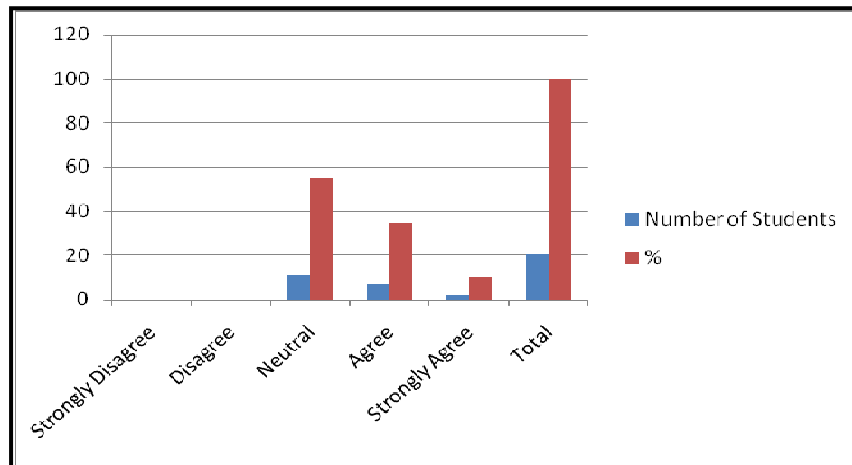


Interpretation:

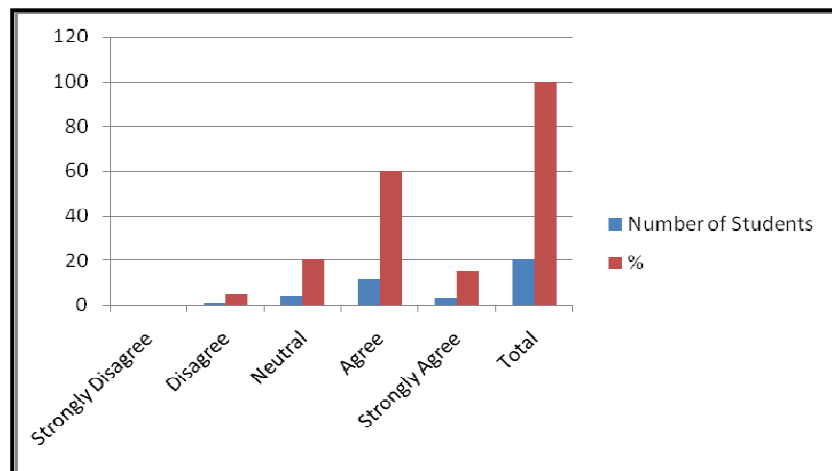


Interpretation:

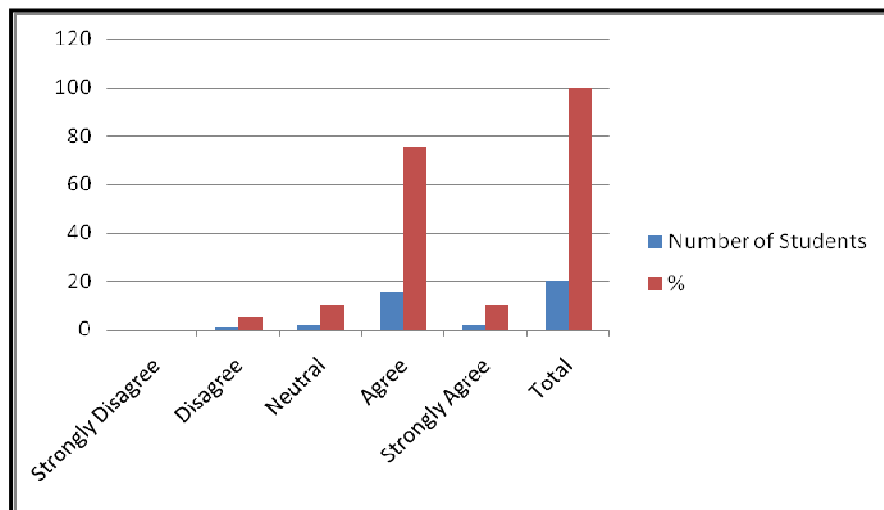

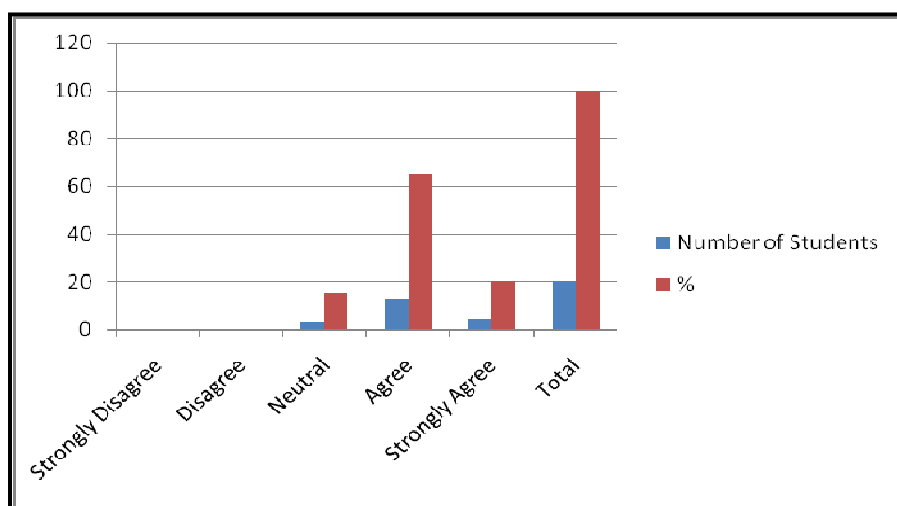

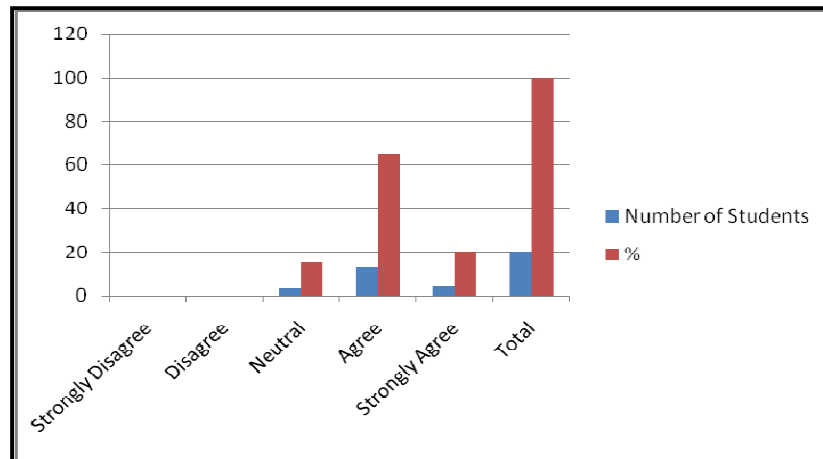

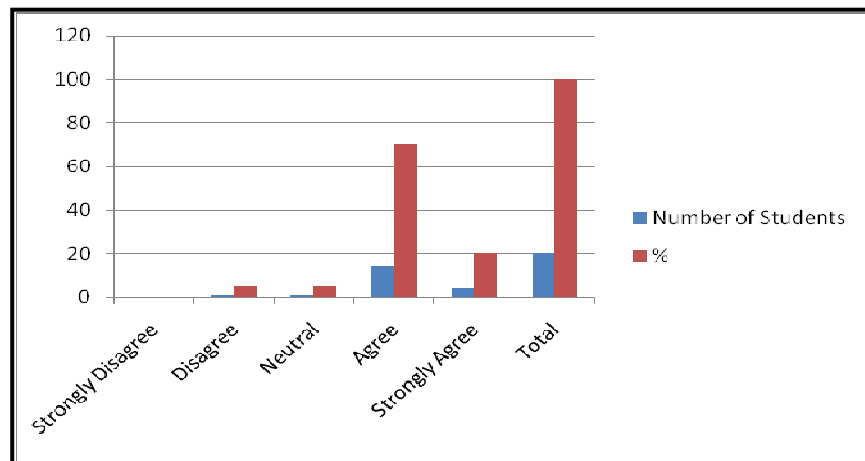


Interpretation:

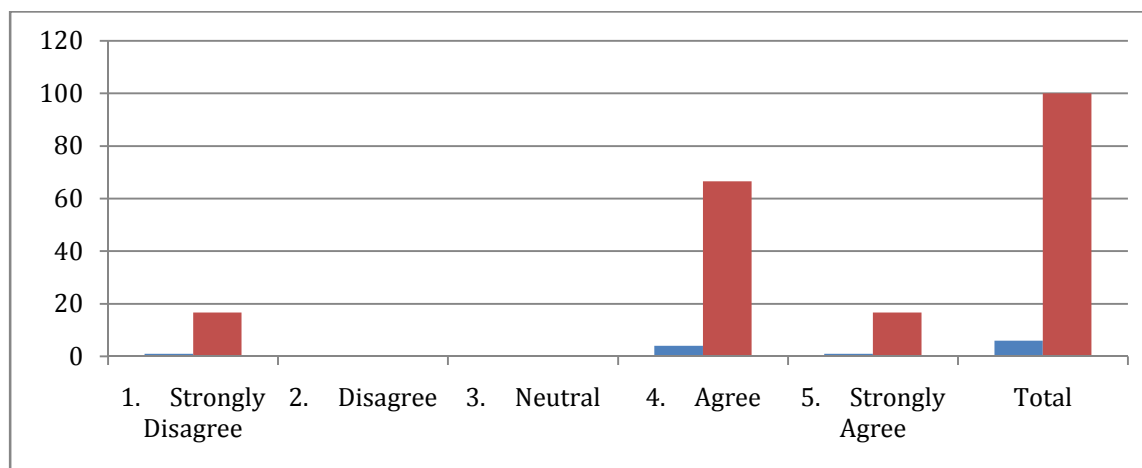

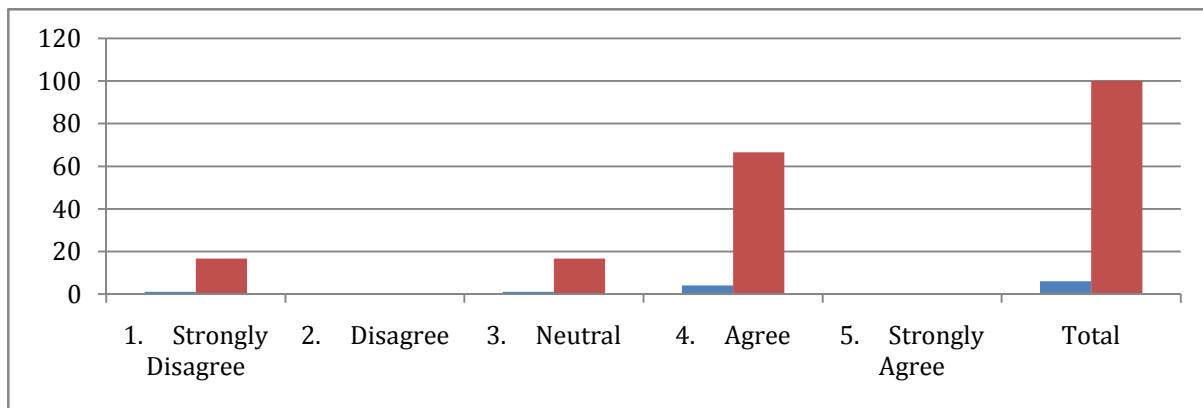
Chart 1: Opinion on the contents of syllabus

Chart 2: Opinion on the current syllabus

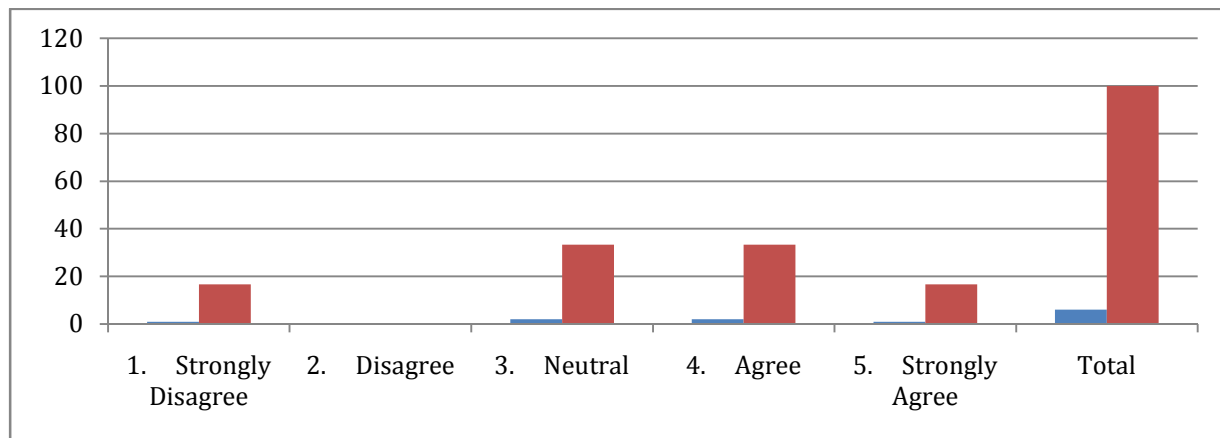


More respondents (66%) highly agreed with the present syllabus's coverage of current events, international concerns, and newly developing national and international media trends.

Chart 3: Opinion on the specific time for coverage of syllabus

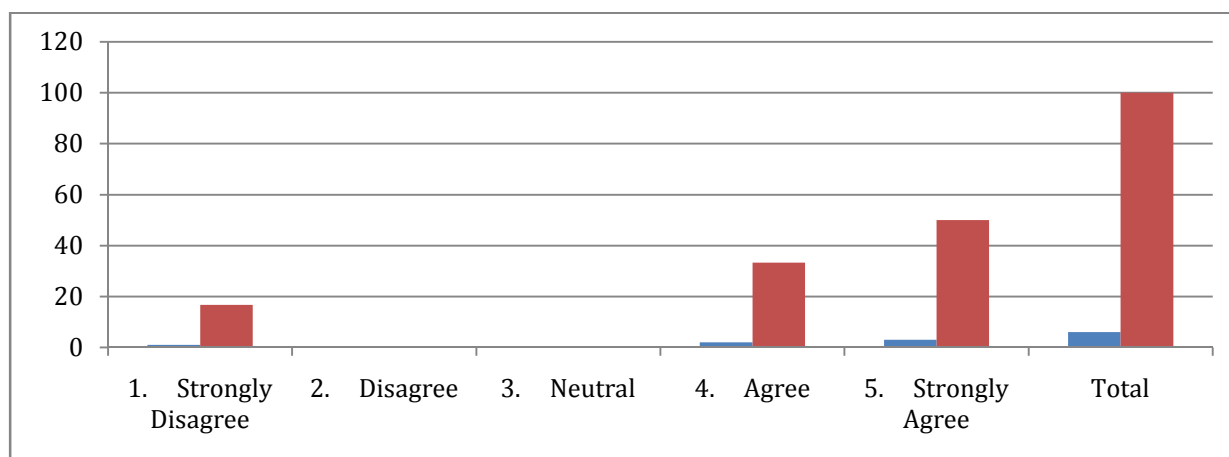


A larger percentage of respondents (66%) expressed strong agreement with the way current events, global issues, and emerging national and worldwide media trends are covered in the current syllabus.

Chart 4: Opinion on the availability of sufficient reference material

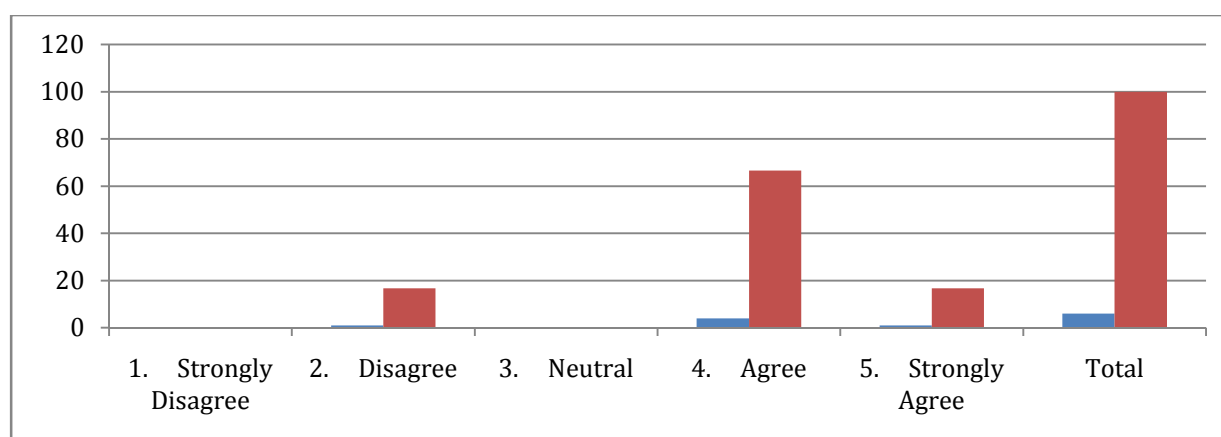

Chart 5: Opinion on the evaluation methods

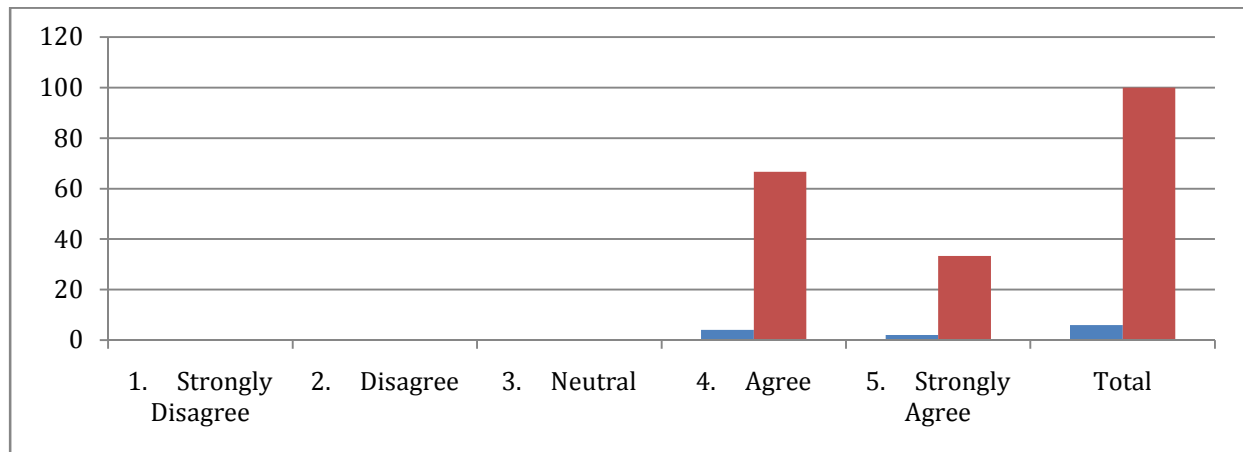

Chart 6: Opinion on contents of the syllabus

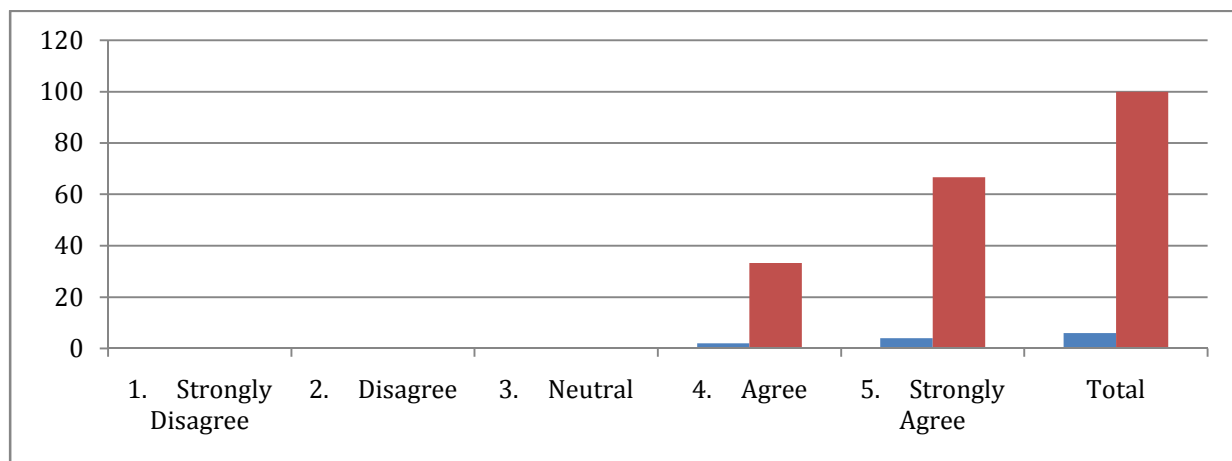

Chart 7: Opinion on Computer oriented practical.

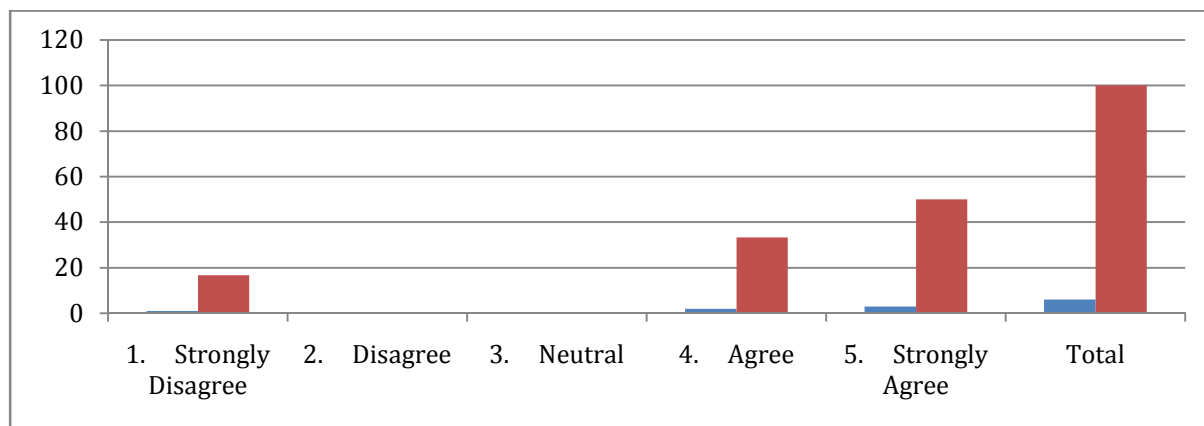

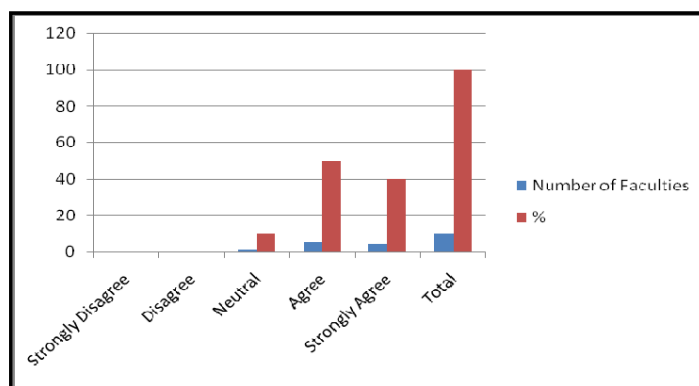

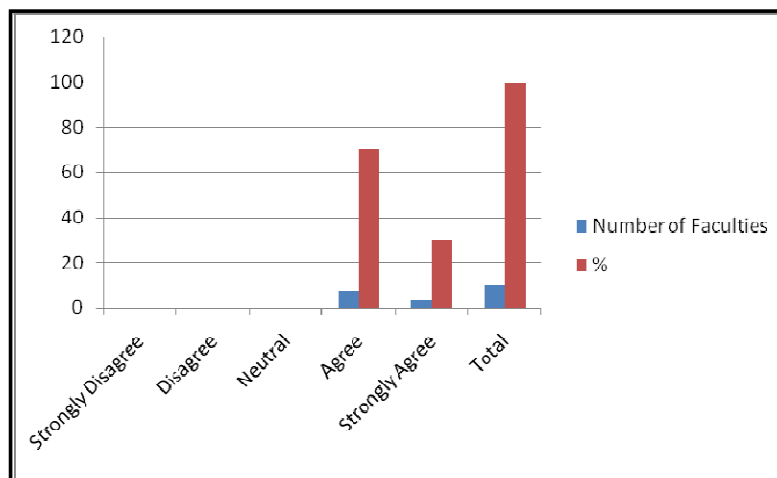

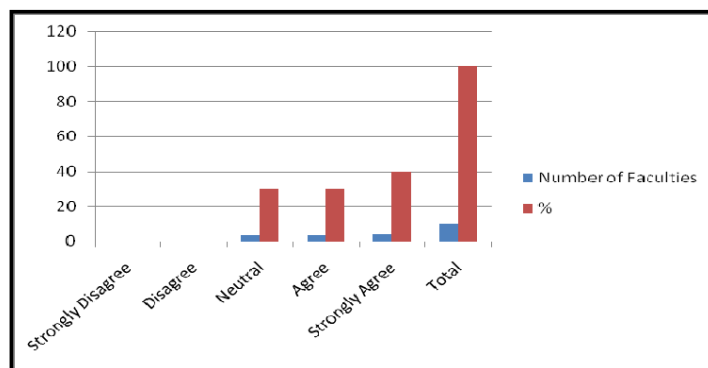

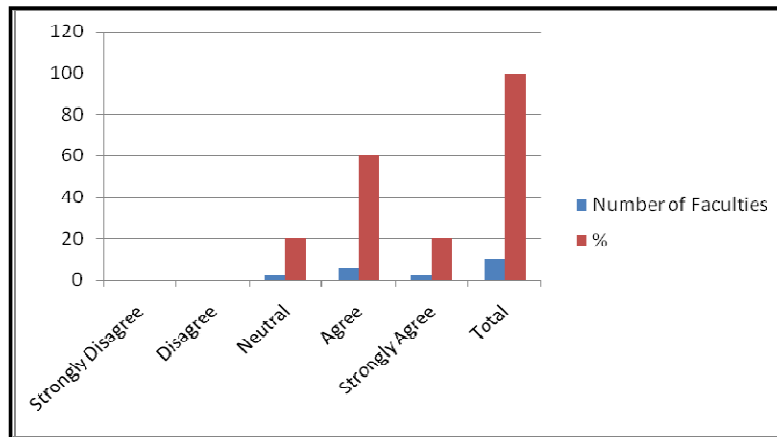

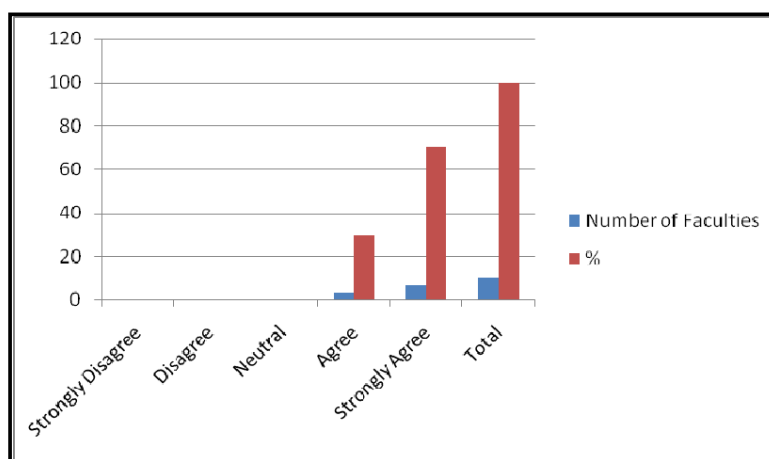

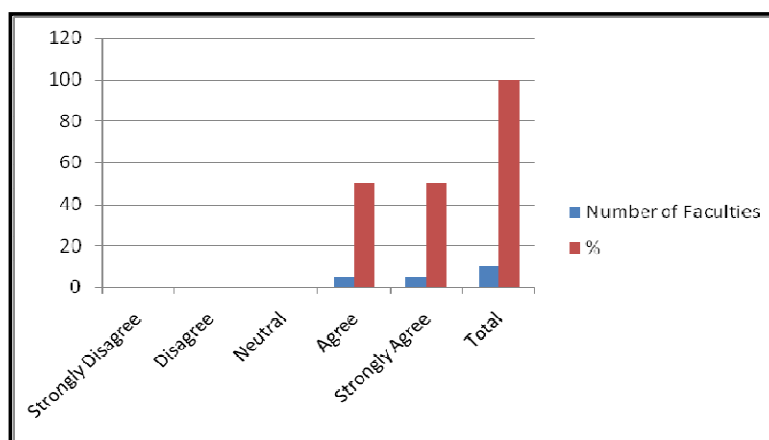

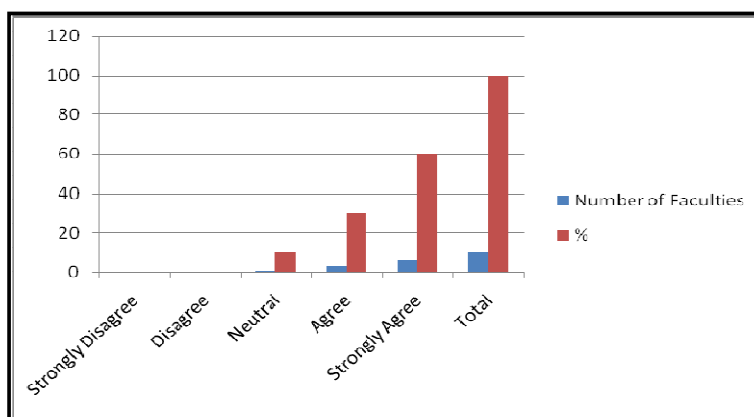

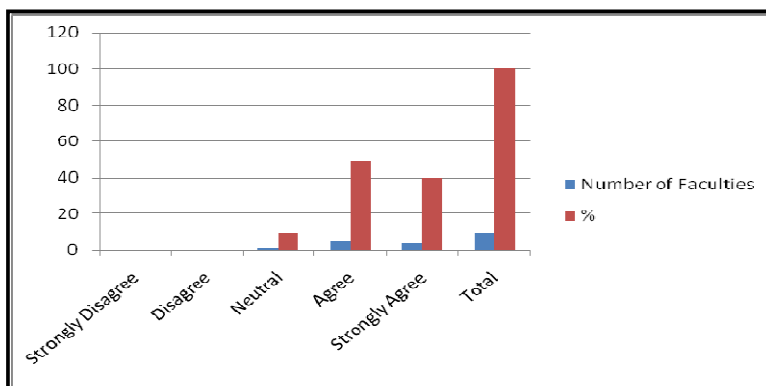

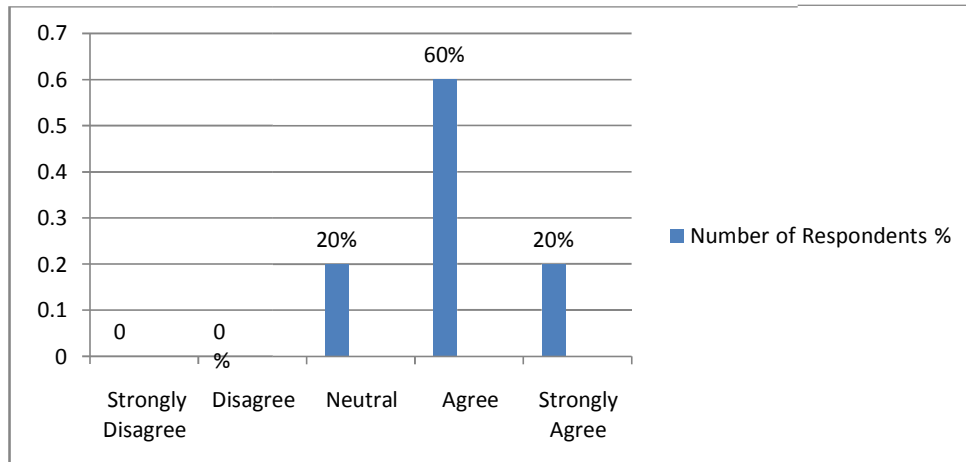

Chart 1: Opinion on Relevance of Curriculum for Employability

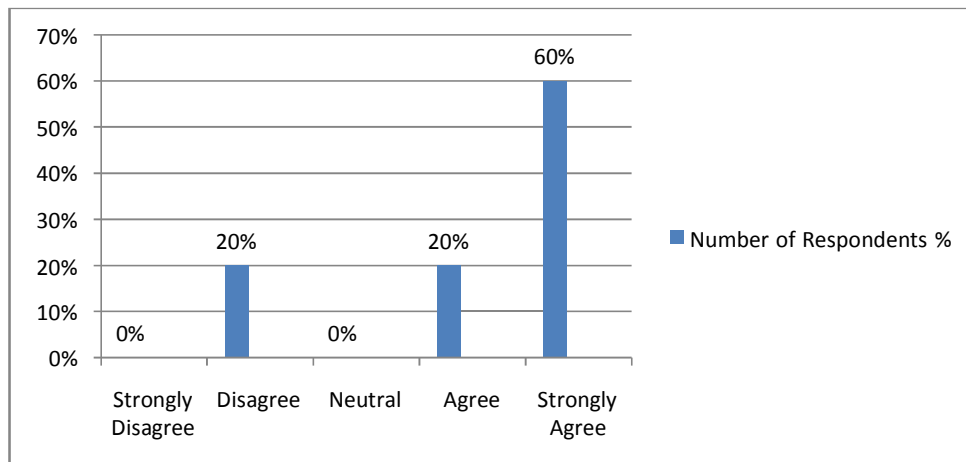

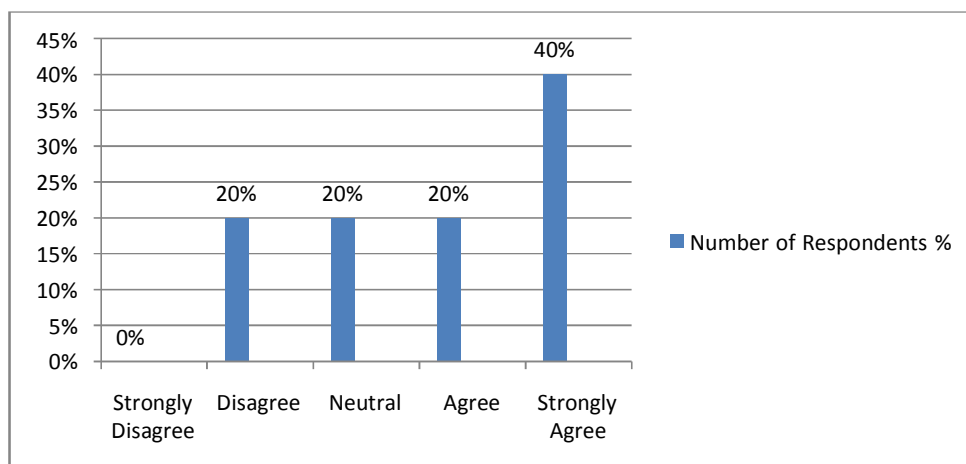
Chart 2: Opinion on Catering the Need and Expectation of Industry**Interpretation:**

Chart- 3: Opinion on Enhancing Knowledge, Skills, Attitude And Innovation



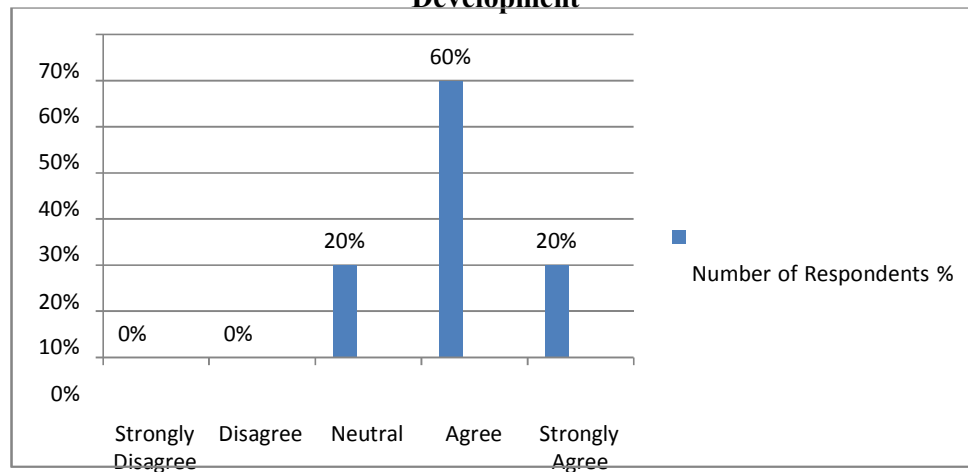

Chart 4: Opinion on Inclusion of Content for Human Resource Development



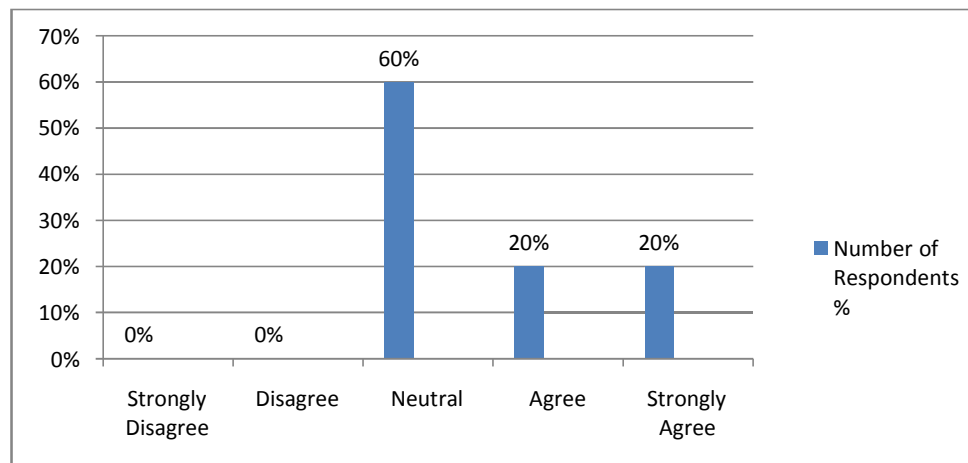

Chart 5: Opinion on Building Entrepreneurial Motives



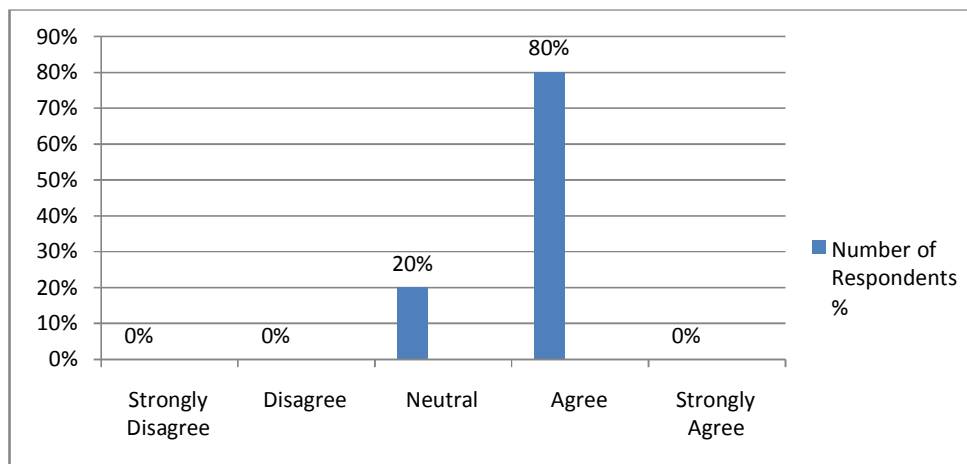

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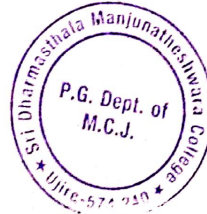
