

Chart1: Theacademic plangiveninad vancehelped metoplanmy academic activities



Chart2:CurrentSyllabusadequatelycoverscontemporarytopics/globalissues/emerging global and national trends in Economics





Chart4:Sufficientreferencematerialsandbooksareavailableinthemainlibraryand departmental library for the topics mentioned in the syllabus





Chart-5: The evaluation methods mentioned in the syllabusare sufficient for providing proper assessment







Chart-7: Contents of the syllabusis relevant to myprofessional development in future









Chart-2:CurrentSyllabusadequatelycoverscontemporarytopics/globalissues/emergingglobal and national trends in Economics.













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

Fig-1:Contentsofsyllabusarerelevanttothecourse



Fig-2:Syllabushasagoodbalancebetweentheoryandpractical aspects



Fig-3:Syllabusprovidescomprehensiveknowledgeandperspectiveinthesubjectarea





Fig-5: Current Syllabus adequately covers contemporary topics /global issues/emerging global and national trends in Economics.







Fig-07: Sufficient reference materials and books are available in the library for the topics mentioned in the Syllabus




