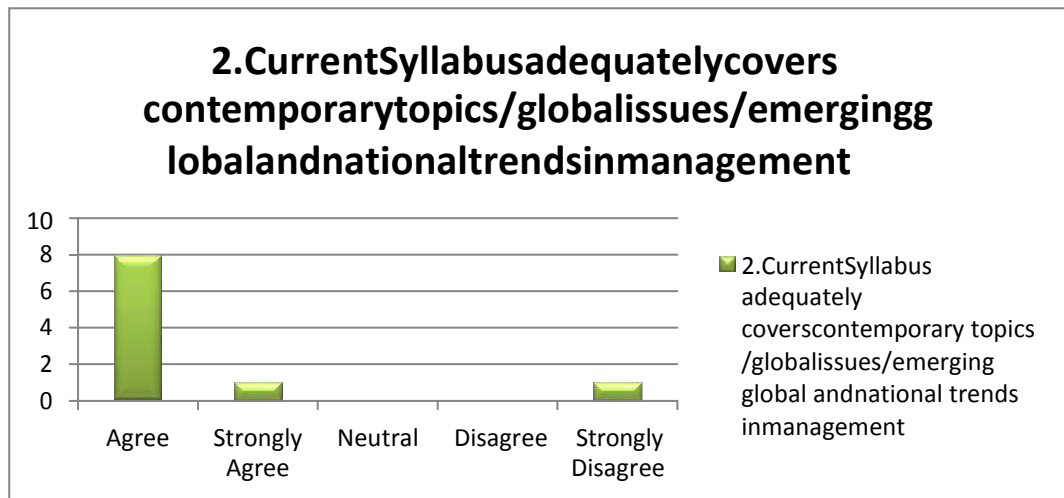

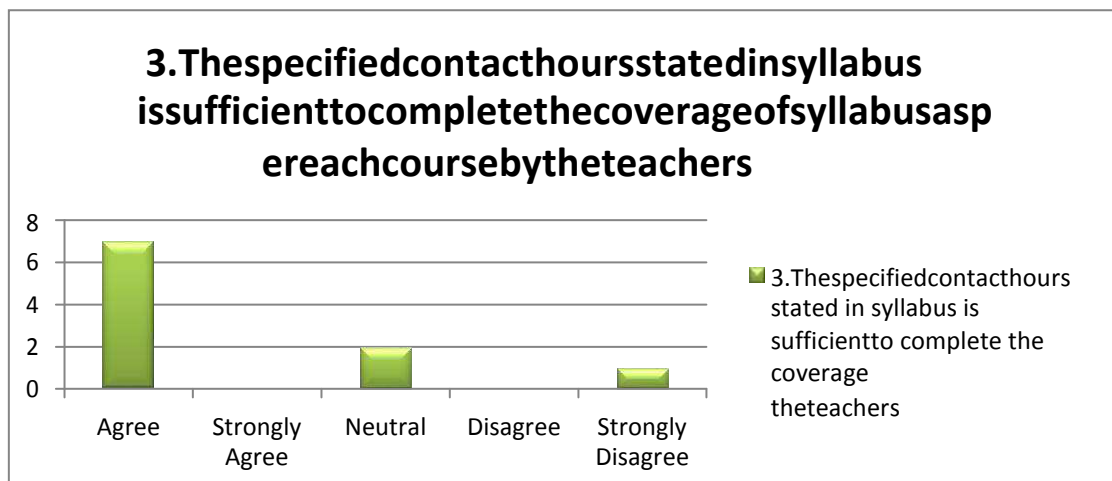

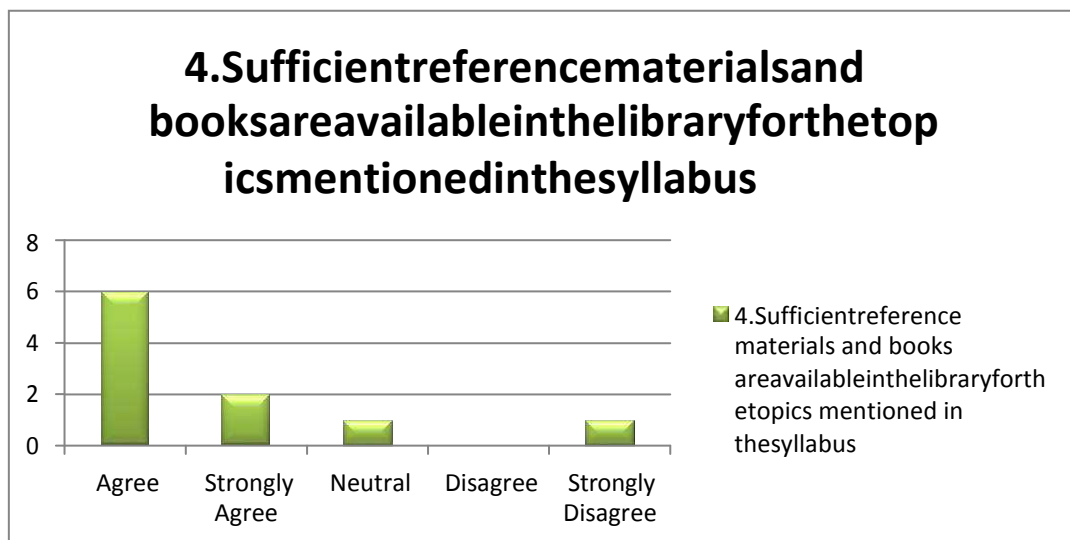

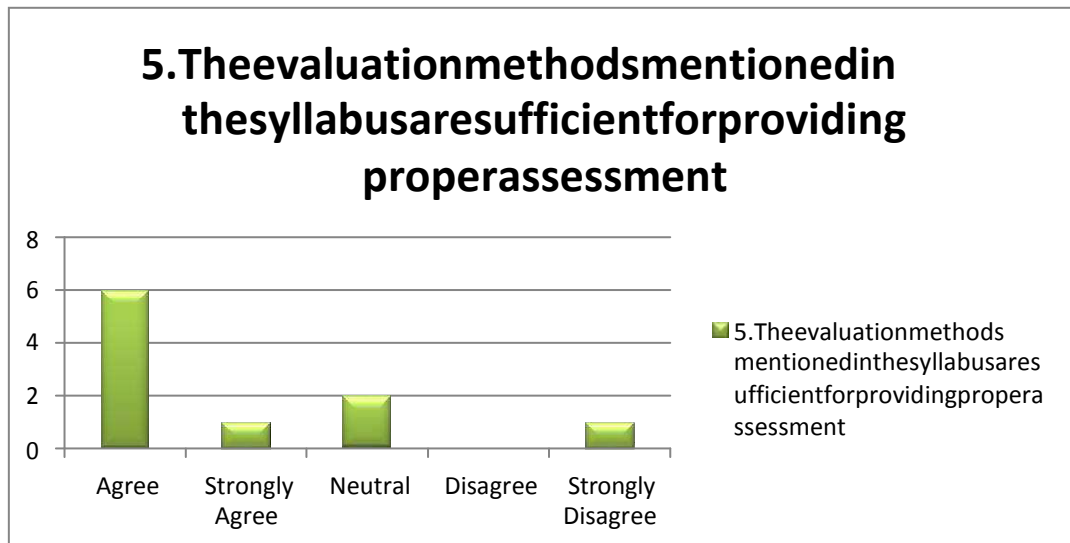

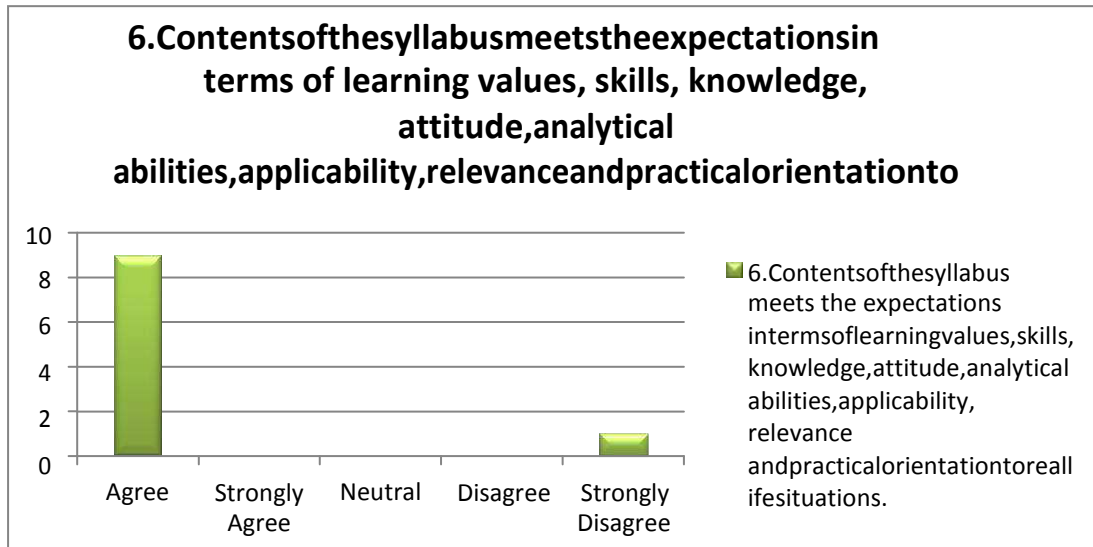

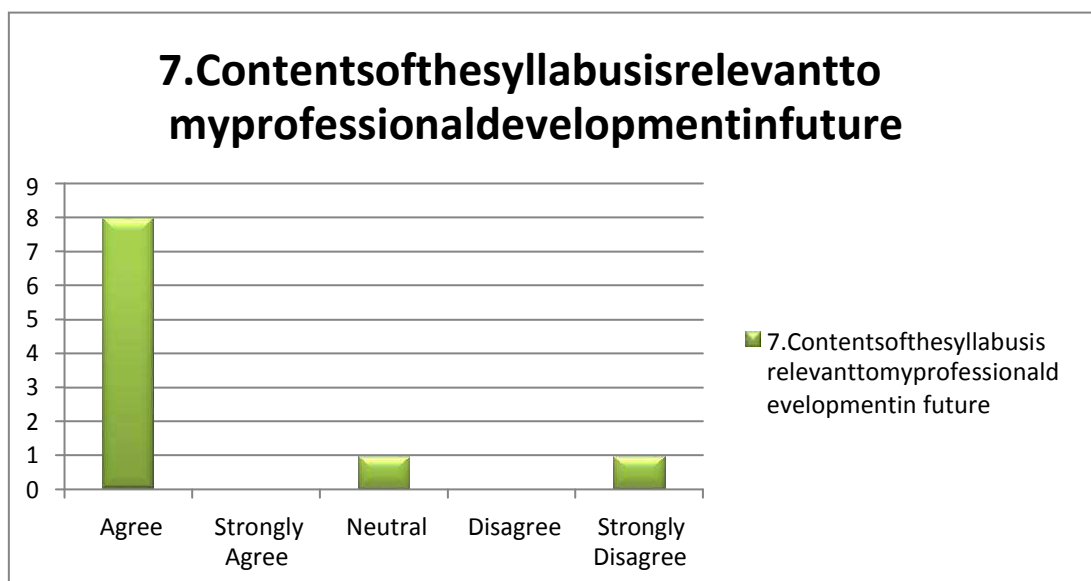

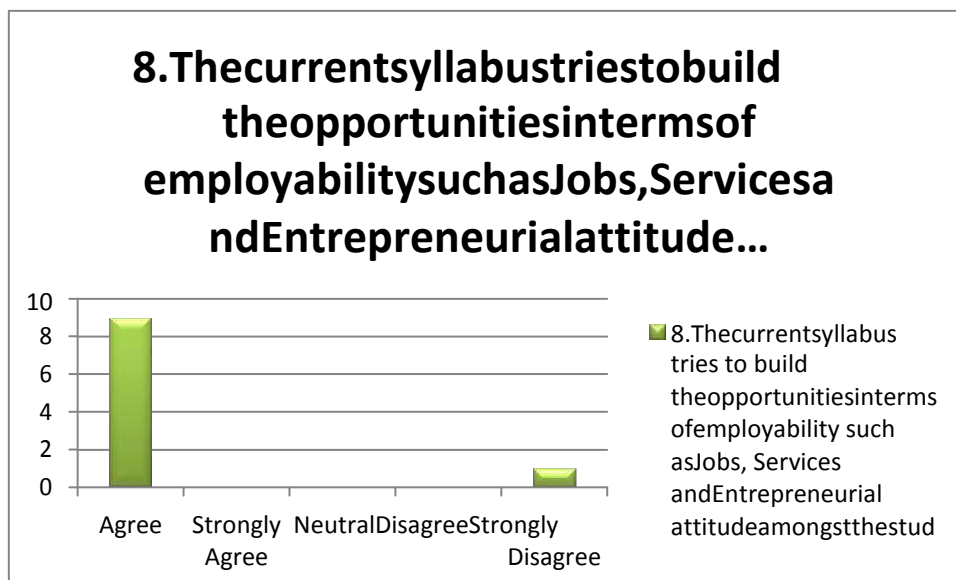

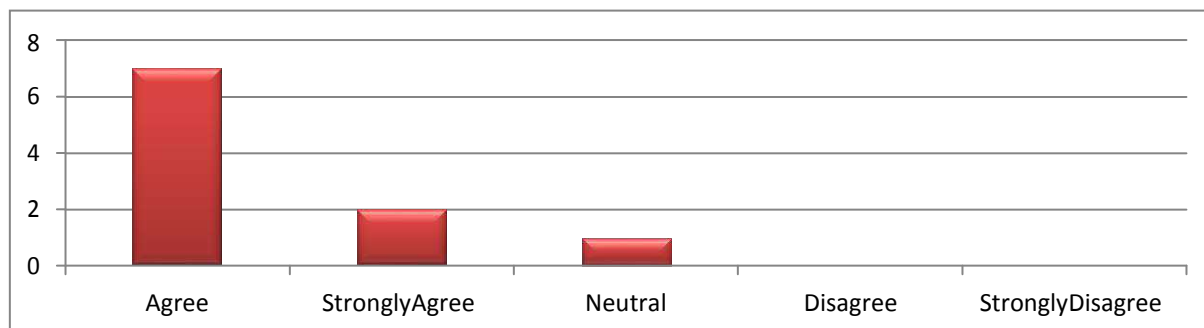

Chart1: The academic plan given in advance helped me to plan my academic activities

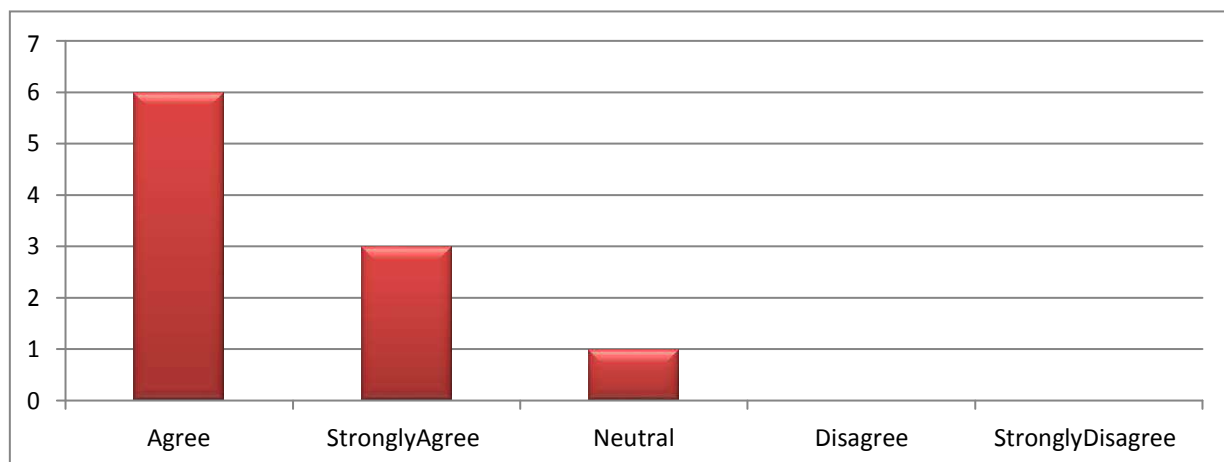

Chart 2: Current Syllabus adequately covers contemporary topics /global issues/emerging global andNational trends inmanagement



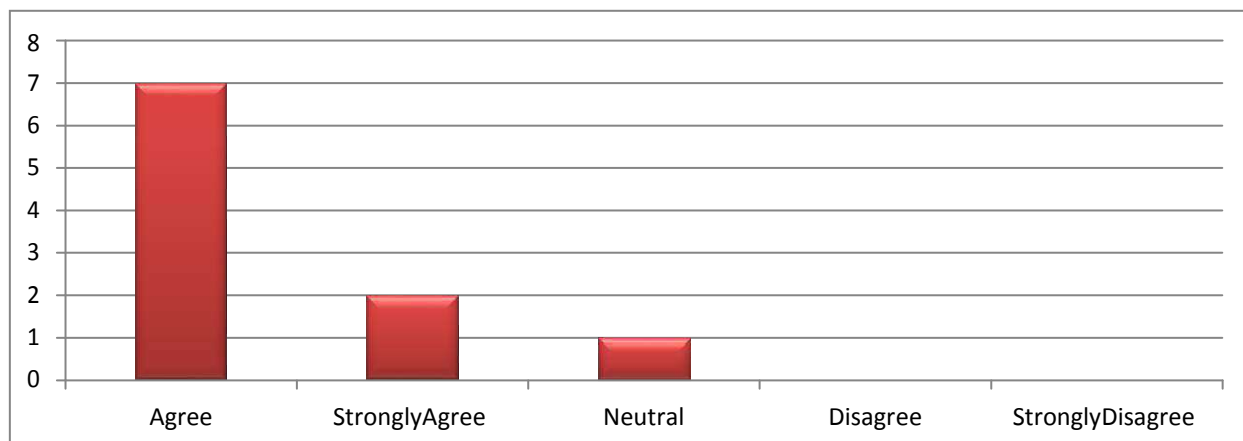

Chart3:Thespecifiedcontacthoursstatedinsyllabusissufficientto completethecoverageofsyllabusaspereac hcourse by theteachers

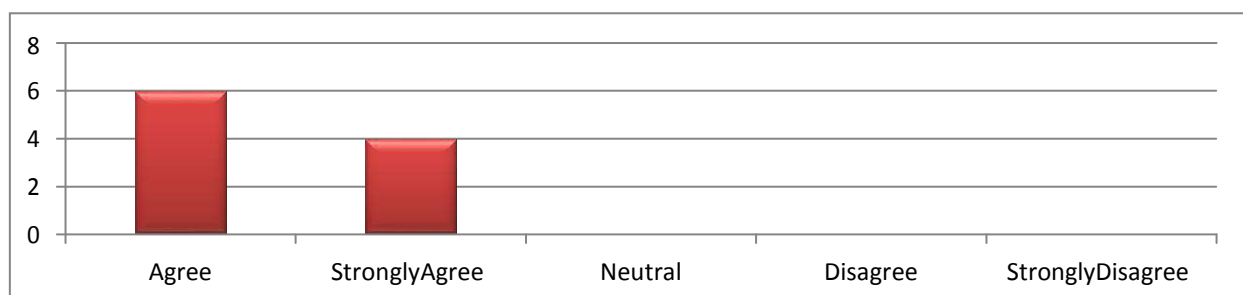

Chart 4: Sufficient reference materials and books are available in the library for the topics mentioned in the syllabus

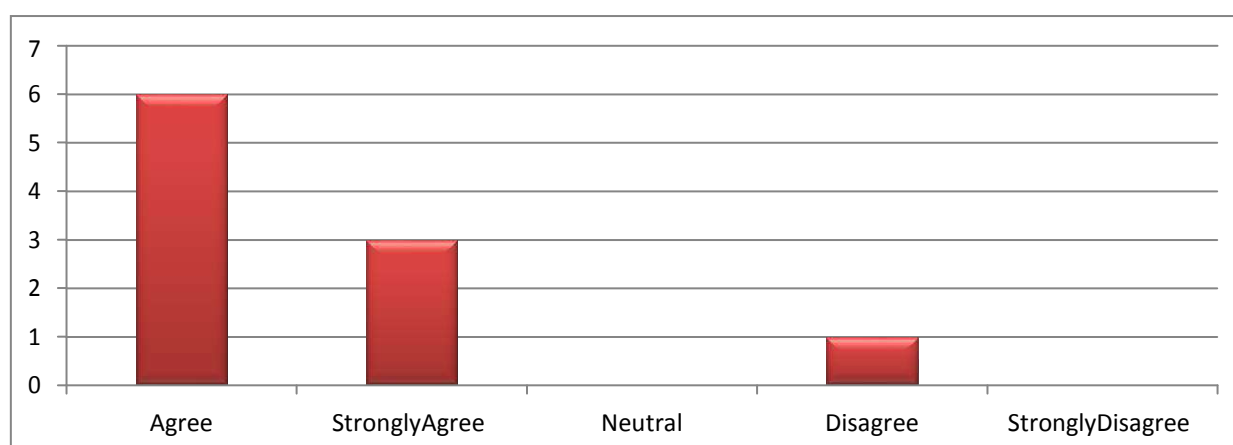

Chart 5: The evaluation methods mentioned in the syllabus are sufficient for providing properassessment

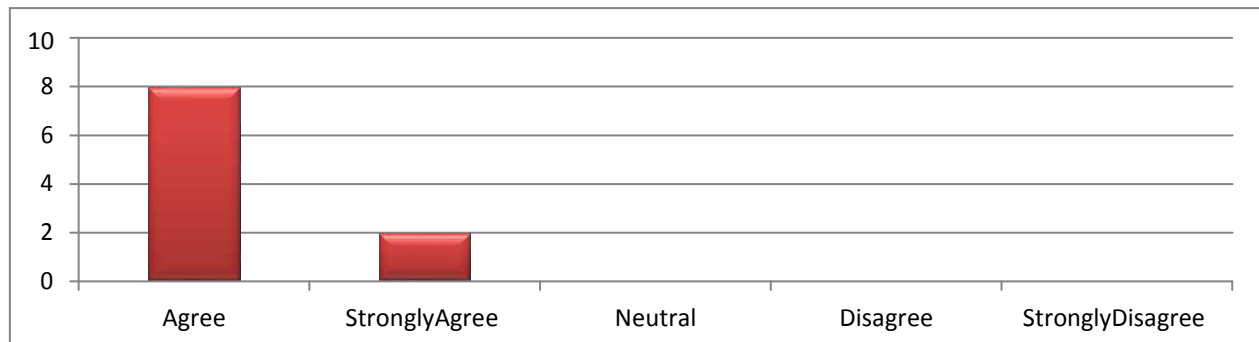

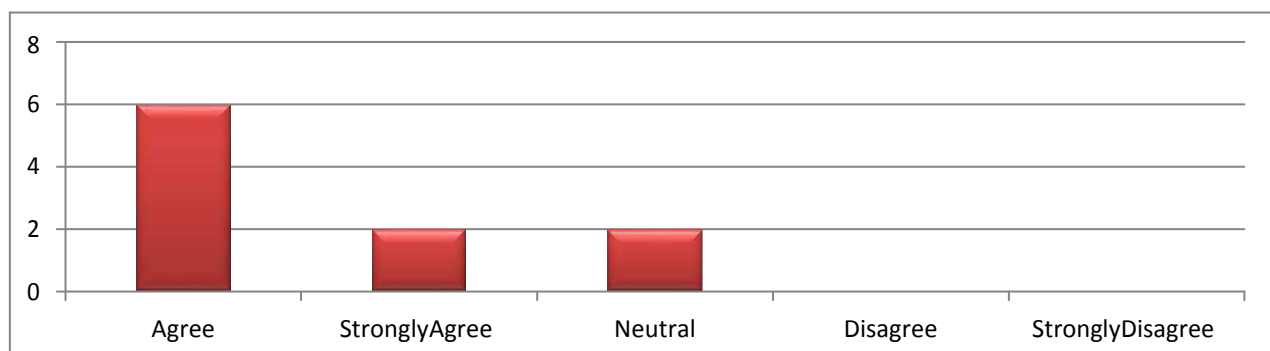

Chart 7: Contents of the syllabus is relevant to my professional development in future

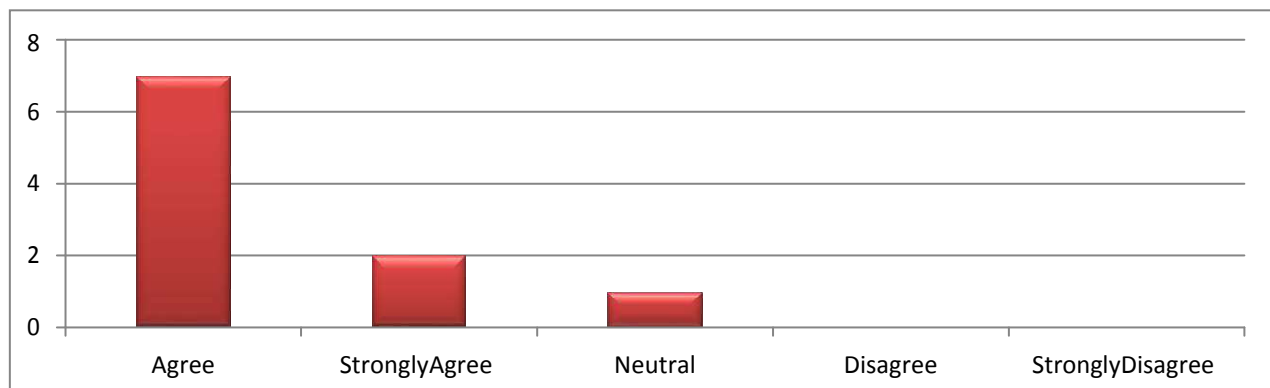

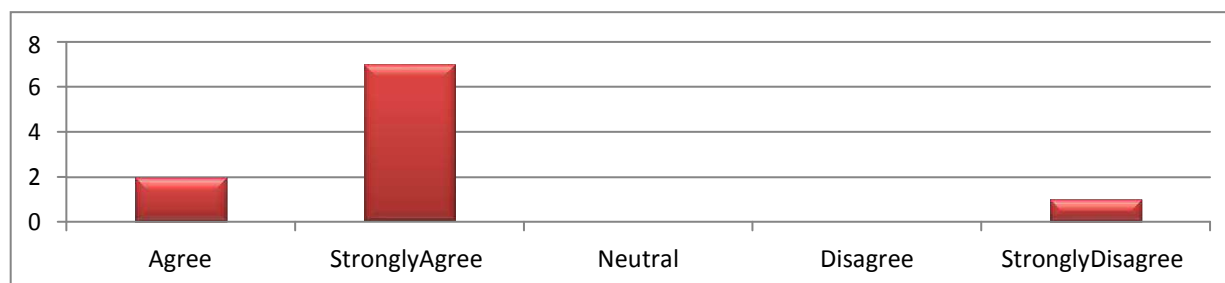

**Chart1: Contents of syllabus are relevant to the course**

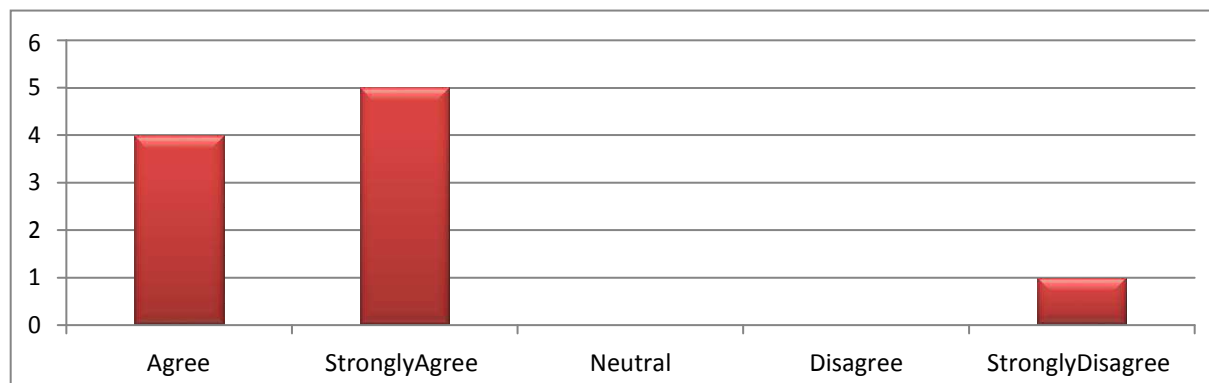

**Chart2:Syllabus hasagoodbalancebetweentheoryandpractical aspects**

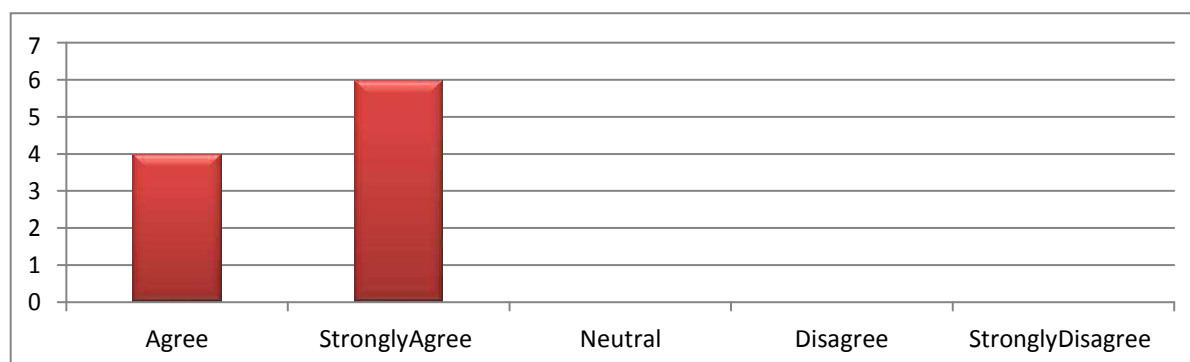

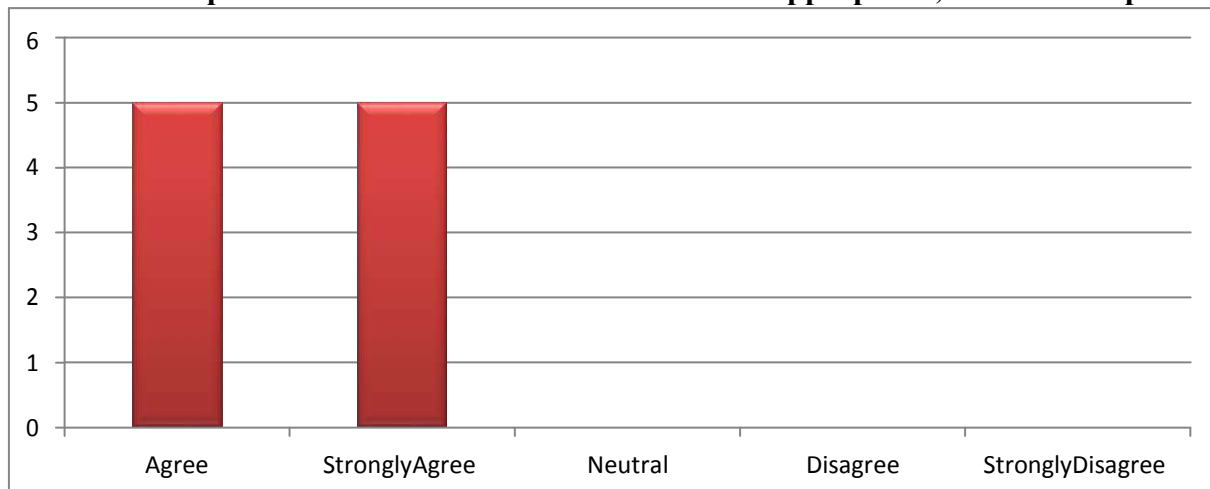
**Chart3:Syllabus provides comprehensive knowledge and perspective in the subject area**

**Chart 4:Books prescribed/listed as referencematerials are appropriate, relevant and updated**

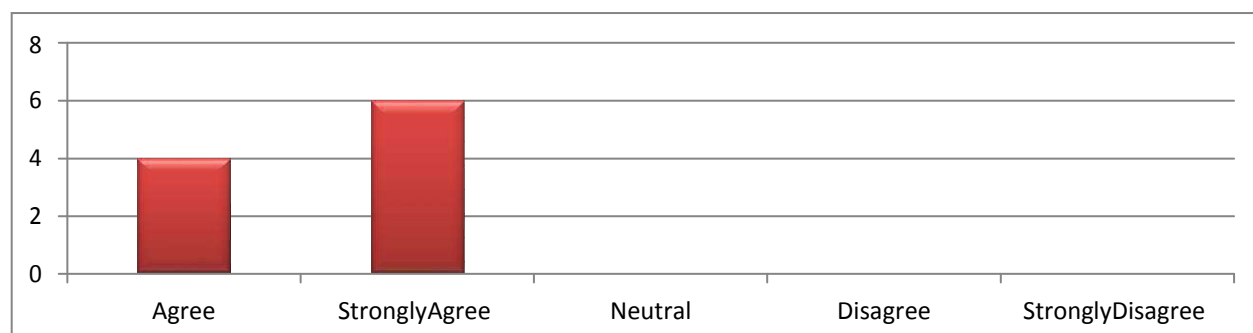

**Chart 5: Current Syllabus adequately covers contemporary topics /global issues/emerging global and national trends in Mathematics**

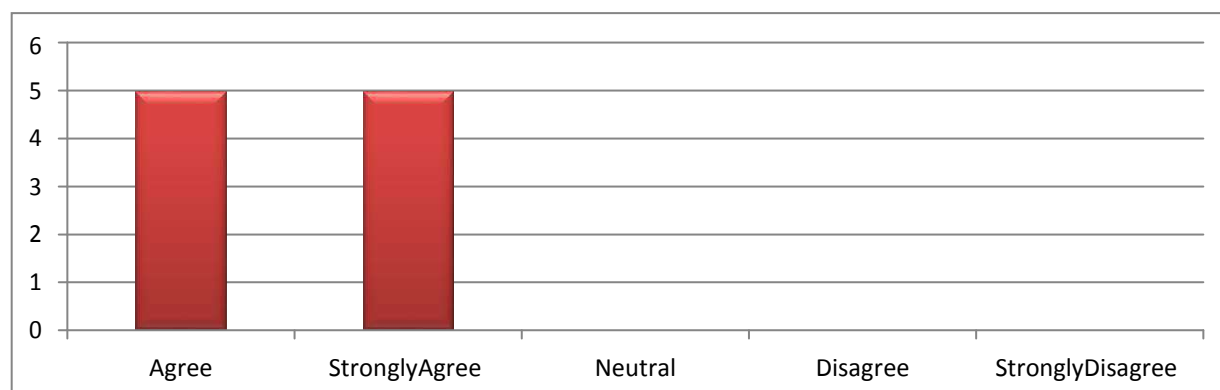

**Chart 6: The specified contact hours stated in syllabus is sufficient to complete the syllabus**

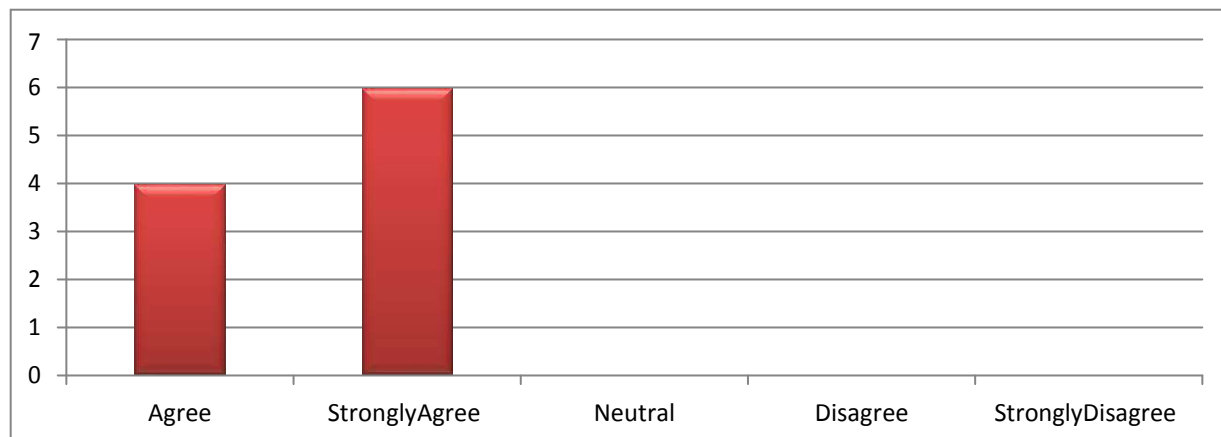

**Chart 7: Sufficient reference materials and books are available in the library for the topics mentioned in the syllabus**



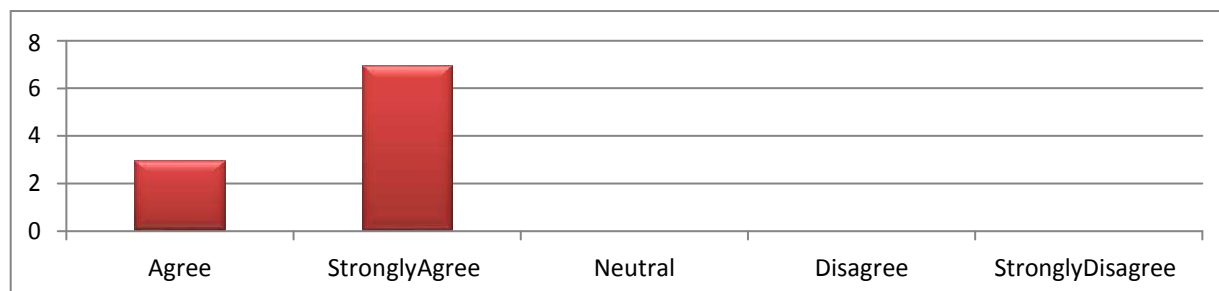

**Chart 8: The evaluation methods mentioned in the syllabus are sufficient for providing proper assessment**

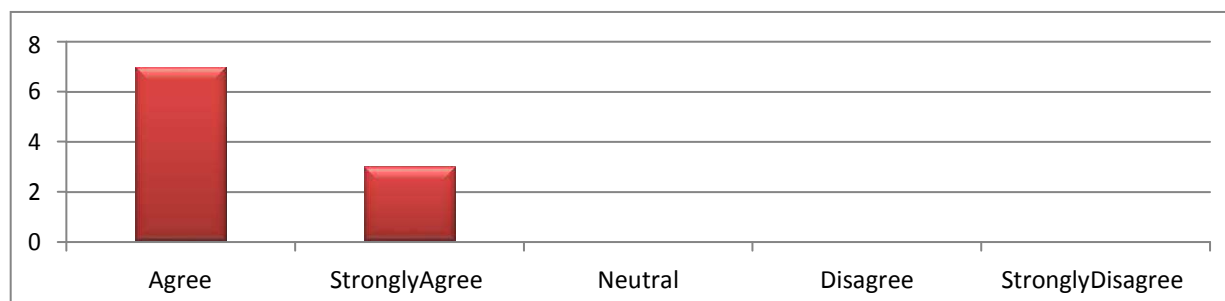
