































The table reflects positive feedback from students, with 66% agreeing and 16.7% strongly agreeing that the syllabus content is comprehensive and aligned with industrial standards. This



Chart 2: Opinion on the current syllabus





Chart 3: Opinion on the specific time for coverage of syllabus



Chart 4: Opinion on the availability of sufficient reference material



Chart 5: Opinion on the evaluation methods









MAJOR FINDINGS

- 4. Concerted efforts have been made to add a new digital dimension to Chiguru, the practice journal, and Nammura Varthe, the department's weekly news bulletin, which play a pivotal role in highlighting contemporary issues through exclusive cover stories, in-depth journalistic analyses, and editorials of democratic and ethical significance.
- 5. Weekly student discussions on news coverage patterns across print, audio, and audiovisual media platforms have been conducted.



Chart 1: Opinion on relevance of curriculum for employability



Chart 2: Opinion on catering the need and expectation of industry





Chart- 3:Opinion on enhancing knowledge, skills, attitude and innovation



Chart 4: Opinion on inclusion of content for human resource development



Chart 5: Opinion on building entrepreneurial motives




