

Chart 1: Opinion on the academic plan









Chart 3: Opinion on the specific time for coverage of syllabus

Chart 4: Opinion on the availability of sufficient reference material



Chart 5: Opinion on the evaluation methods



Chart 6: Opinion on contents of the syllabus



Chart 7: Opinion on Contents of the syllabus relevant for future professional development





Chart 1: Opinion on the contents of syllabus





Chart 3: Opinion on the specific contact hour for the coverage of syllabus



Chart 4: Opinion on the availability of sufficient reference material



Chart 5: Opinion on the evaluation methods



Chart 6: Opinion on contents of the syllabus



Chart 7: Opinion on topics on national development







Chart 1: Contents of syllabus are relevant to the course




Chart 3: Syllabus provides comprehensive knowledge and perspective in the subject area Interpretation:




Chart 4: Books prescribed/ listed as reference materials are appropriate, relevant and updated




Chart 5: Current Syllabus adequately covers contemporary topics /global issues/emerging global and national trends in management




Chart 6: The specified contact hours stated in syllabus is sufficient to complete the syllabus




Chart 7: Sufficient reference materials and books are available in the library for the topics mentioned in the syllabus




Chart 8: The evaluation methods mentioned in the syllabus are sufficient for providing proper assessment



MAJOR SUGGESTIONS

- The syllabus is comprehensive and has a blend of theory and practical. The idea of emphasizing on group activities, using multimedia will enhance the skills. However it is advisable to update the books and references by newer editions and publications. It is also better to encourage students to take some swayam or mooc courses. The faculty also could contribute by developing programs under swayam and mooc courses.
- 2. Cognitive neuroscience paper can be added mainly students aiming at M.Phil in clinical psychology will be benefitted
- 3. more recent boks are to be added for the list of books for study and reference
- 4. more emphasis can be given to the practical component
- Incorporating service learning/community service practical paper in the first semester would be great. Evaluation/assessment plan with break-up of marks needs to be specified in the syllabus
- 6. Recent edition books and few recent trends and concepts can be included in the syllabus.
- 7. Statistics need not be a separate core paper, it can be included in quantitative research methods, SPSS should be mandatorily covered in practical paper.
- 8. In theories of personality and assessment of personality-avoid overlap and repetition from UG courses
- 9. Research dissertation should be mandatory, not optional with project work. Use the term supervised internship for case observations and other field work done.
- 10. Dissertation to be started from II Semester with credits allotted and submission in IV semester

- 11. most of the practical are soft core papers as students need to have hands on experience and good practical skills better to have few practical as hard core too.
- 12. design the syllabus and assessment based on blooms taxonomy
- 13. Course' specific outcomes (No: PS01-08) are expressed in a general way. I would recommend to redefine them with more clarity and precision.
- 14. Give emphasis for Specialization in the Second year (III, IV semester).
- 15. Course outcomes have to be more realistic and tangible. After the course, the learner has to get some kind of skill from the particular subject.
- 16. If Hard core papers are offering the practicum it will improve the strength of the courses.

ACTION TAKEN

- 1. Following Blooms taxonomy in the setting of question papers which would enhance the skill among students to think in critical, creative and analytical manner.
- 2. Reference section has been updated with recent books and more relevant sources of information
- 3. Learning outcomes were improved in the syllabus
