Principal's Desk

Undergraduate students have just given their first, third, and fifth semester-end examinations. Postgraduate courses of the first and third semesters are ending. As the college has the tradition of declaring results within 15 days of the completion of the examinations, BA, B Com, and BBA V Semester results have been published already. At this juncture, the students work hard on their examinations, and teachers focus on evaluation. Parents and society at large are waiting to see the Results.

Educational institutions are often considered examination-driven institutions for over-emphasising the test and evaluation system. However, the continuous and comprehensive evaluation system of internal and semester-end examinations has been evaluated as not a separate entity but as the total result of the student's overall performance. After the introduction of NEP, 40% of marks are assessed internally. Further, every teacher uses this opportunity judiciously to evaluate the performance of individual students by providing activities, participatory learning contexts and opportunities to exhibit their hidden individual talents apart from the internal tests. This heavily emphasises class participation and learning in a team. There are several opportunities for the students to improve their performance by interacting with their classmates and friends.

Correction at this stage is an important activity. The marks in the semester-end examination will just reflect a few numbers, but the actual performance is in moulding the personality of individual students for socio-economic relevance. In the process of CCE, the students get to interact, participate, and realise their strengths and weaknesses, and as a result, they work focused on their opportunities and challenges. Hence, most of the students perform very well to be placed in some companies of international reputation in the campus interviews and perform well in their life. I consider this strongly as experiential learning.
